PHASE 1 - Improvements to East Croydon

Introduction

Croydon Council have appointed John McAslan and Partners to lead a team in the development of the East Croydon Interchange project.

The site area currently lacks the identity that such an important arrival and departure point deserves. The area is blighted by traffic, poor materials and furniture and offers a relatively poor pedestrian and arrival experience.

Aims and Objectives

- Improved interchange between transport modes
- Provide high quality, accessible and safe facilities for walking, cycling and users of public transport.
- Support creation of a town-centre wide network of public space.
- Encourage pedestrians to use both footways in George Street
- Improve public perception of Croydon as an attractive place with a unique character and identity and as a place to live and invest in

When will the works happen?

• PHASE 1 start on site: 19 January 2015

• PHASE 2 start on site: Proposed Autumn 2015













PHASE 1 - Landscape Masterplan




East Croydon Station Frontage Proposals









Artists Impressions - East Croydon Tram Stop
















SUMMARY OF PROPOSALS

- 1. Road crossings at Wellesley Road clearly delineated with new surface treatment
- 2. Existing trees to be retained and remove poor quality vegetation
- 3. Enhanced quality surface materials to pavements
- 4. New planting to the central reservation
- 5. New and more bins and seats along George Street
- 6. New Road surface
